Newly named fund in ovarian cancer research announced by Royal Alexandra Hospital Foundation and Alberta Women's Health Foundation

Edmonton's James H. Brown & Associates makes first donation to newly named fund in support of women's health research at Women & Children's Health Research Institute at Lois Hole Hospital for Women and the University of Alberta

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EDMONTON, AB—The Royal Alexandra Hospital Foundation and Alberta Women's Health Foundation are excited to announce a new name in the fight against ovarian cancer: the Edmonton Elks Women's Ovarian Cancer Research Endowment. The fund supports local researchers in their ongoing work to develop an early detection system and new treatment protocols in ovarian cancer—a disease whose stealth, silence, and deadly outcomes makes it one of the most feared gynecological cancers in women.

"Like the strength of competition on the gridiron, this fund does a lot of heavy lifting in the lab," said Sharlene Rutherford, President and CEO of the Royal Alexandra Hospital Foundation and Alberta Women's Health Foundation. "We're proud to rename this fund, grateful to Elks Football, and really excited to start the next chapter on research excellence and outcomes."

The fund, originally started in 2008 by women who work with or were connected to the front office of the team, announced the fund in memory of long-time EE staffer, Pam Monastyrskyj. Pam succumbed to ovarian cancer after a lengthy and courageous battle that inspired everyone around her, both on and off the field.

Newly named to reflect the exciting new chapter in Edmonton's CFL Football franchise, the Edmonton Elks Women's Ovarian Cancer Research Endowment grows each year through annual contributions made by the team's Annual Women's Dinner, and other fundraising activities.

Today, the fund received additional support through the generous contribution of Edmonton business James H. Brown & Associates, long-time supporters of the Annual Women's Dinner.

"If clinical care and new treatment protocols are the engine of healthcare, then the track it follows is research. We are grateful to James H. Brown & Associates for demonstrating alliance, allegiance and a commitment to this research," Rutherford continued, "And we look forward to demonstrating how this support helps to take us from lab to life."

Each year the endowed fund will support the work of Research Chair Dr. Cheng-Han Lee, a Canadian leader and innovator who is taking a provincial approach to the research in his lab.

Dr. Lee brings vast experience to his lead as Research Chair, including the recognition of a new cancer type that was subsequently adopted in the World Health Organization (WHO) classification system for tumours of the female reproductive system. With his clinician-scientist training background, the focus of his research over the past decade has been on the genetics and biology of aggressive gynecological cancers.

Dr. Lee is a member of the Women and Children's Health Research Institute (WCHRI), a university-affiliated research institute that receives funding from the Alberta Women's Health Foundation and Royal Alexandra Hospital Foundation and, in the case of this Research Chair, the Alberta Cancer Foundation.

"We look forward to working closely with Dr. Lee and this includes ensuring that the Edmonton Elks football club has every opportunity to learn how its fund directly supports his work," concluded Rutherford. "So, let's get back to it, shall, we? Let's move forward and achieve wins on the field and wins in the lab."
